October is LGBTQ+ History Month!

This month includes many dates of importance to the LGBTQ+ community. Below is a brief history on these dates.

LGBTQ+ History Month

LGBTQ+ History Month originated in the United States as Lesbian and Gay History Month, and was first celebrated in October 1994. It was founded by Missouri high-school history teacher Rodney Wilson, who gathered other teachers and community leaders to create the designation. October was chosen as the month of celebration because the first and second LGBT Marches on Washington, in 1979 and 1987, were in October; and National Coming Out Day is on October 11th.





National Coming Out Day

NCOD was started in 1988 by Robert Eichberg and Jean O'Leary. Eichberg, who died in 1995 of complications from AIDS, was a psychologist from New Mexico. O'Leary was an openly lesbian political leader and long-time activist from New York and was at the time the head of the National Gay Rights Advocates in Los Angeles. The date of October 11th was chosen because it is the anniversary of the 1987 National March on Washington for Lesbian and Gay Rights.







International Pronouns Day

IPD began in 2018 and takes place on the 3rd Wednesday of October each year. IPD seeks to make respecting, sharing, and educating about personal pronouns commonplace. While many are familiar with "He" "She" and "They", Neopronouns are a category of third-person pronouns that include; xe/xir/xirs, ze/zir/zirs, fae/faer/faers and more. Spirit Day

Spirit Day is an annual LGBTQ awareness day observed on the third Thursday in October. Started in 2010 by Canadian teenager Brittany McMillan, it was initially created in response to a rash of widely publicized bullying-related suicides of gay school students in 2010, including that of Tyler Clementi. Promoted by GLAAD, observers wear the color purple as a visible sign of support for LGBTQ youth and against bullying during National Bullying Prevention Month as well as to honor LGBTQ victims of suicide.

Ace Week

Ace Week was first established as Asexual Awareness Week in 2010. When founder Sara Beth Brooks discovered asexuality and realized that it was something she identified with, she used her organizational skills and activism experience to support the ace community. She solicited the help of AVEN (Asexual Visibility and Education Network) founder David Jay, Asexual Outreach, and together, they transformed a mainly online observance into an international campaign.





Intersex Awareness Day

ISA on October 26th commemorates the first public demonstration by intersex people in North America. In 1996, Intersex activists Morgan Holmes, Max Beck, and more protested outside of the American Academy of Pediatrics annual conference.

Intersex Awareness Day is to end shame, secrecy and unwanted surgeries on intersex children. Between October 26 and November 8, intersex organizations bring attention to the challenges intersex individuals face, culminating in the Intersex Day of Remembrance on November 8th.


Garden State Equality is holding their 14th annual Equality Walk!


